

The Edinburgh military tattoo




It is the most picturesque part of the Royal Mile, which gives a good idea of what the Old Town was like. Closes lead to little yards and attractive historical buildings.

The Royal Mile




A big royal palace which is the residence of the Queen when she is in Edinburgh.




It lies between the New Town and the Old Town and is connected with the name of the famous writer, Sir Walter Scott.


Princess Street
